Sarasota Hosts Scottish and Canadian Bowlers for Commonwealth Games Selection

The Sarasota Lawn Bowling Club in Sarasota, Florida hosted 65 bowlers, as well as selectors and coaches, from Canada and Scotland hoping to be selected for the 2014 Commonwealth Games in Glasgow, Scotland.

The 2014 Commonwealth Games, officially the XX Commonwealth Games, will be held in Glasgow, Scotland, United Kingdom over 11 days of competition from July 23 to August 3, 2014. A unique, world-class event, it is held every four years and is often referred to as the 'Friendly Games'. There will be 6,500 athletes from 70 countries competing in 17 sports, one of which is lawn bowling, over the 11 day period.

Sarasota was chosen as a site for the selections because their grass greens run at about the same speed as those in Glasgow in August. Five men and five women from each country will be selected to play singles, pairs and fours. The selections will be announced later this month.

The Sarasota club invited the neighboring clubs of Sun City, Maple Leaf, Lakeland, Clearwater, Sun 'N Fun and Top of the World to watch and hosted a BBQ and band one evening.

About the Greens

Helpful Maintenance Hints for Performance Greens

At this time of year clubs are struggling with: slow greens, levelness, bowl deviation, smoothness, insect infestations, moss buildup, fungal, bare spots, compaction, weeds and worst of all irrigation management.

Slow green: thatch buildup is a major contributor to slow green's speed. Verti-cutting removes thatch and prevents buildup.

Levelness, bowl deviation, smoothness; bumpy surface caused by undulations and thatch on the surface of the green will deflect a delivered bowl from its intended target. Frequent verti-cutting will remove the thatch and level the playing field maintaining it at recommended tolerance levels.

Insect infestation; flying insects lay their eggs on the surface of the turf. Regular verti-cutting disturbs the eggs and prevents them from hatching, controlling insects and bird damage.

Moss and fungal; caused by over irrigation and compaction. Standing water remains on the surface giving way to infestations. Regular aeration and strict management of irrigation is a must.

Compaction is the main cause of bare spots. This is more noticeable around the perimeter of the greens. Aeration relieves soil compaction, providing nutrients to the root system.

Weeds; broad-leaf weeds such as Pearlwort infest coastal greens this time of year. Apply selective broadleaf herbicide to control this weed. Speed-Zone Southern is the one herbicide I recommend. It kills all broadleaf weeds without damage to the Bent grass. Poe-annua is a narrow-leaf weed. A non-selective herbicide is needed to kill this weed, however, non-selective herbicide will also kill the Bentgrass.



Los Angeles County Parks and Recreation Department recently purchased a new Smithco Tournament Roller for use at the Santa Anita Bowling Green Club in Arcadia, Ca. The roller is designed to be used exclusively on lawn bowling greens, golf course greens and grass tennis courts. It utilizes two 8" rollers to achieve a "billiard table" surface. Both 8" rollers are driven and both are used for steering. Santa Anita will host approximately 400 bowlers during the South West Division Open, March 29 to April 3, 2014.

TIPS FOR SHOT SELECTION, TACTICS & PLAYING SHOTS

1:SIMPLICITY: The easier shot is usually the right shot to play.

2:**SCOREBOARD GUIDANCE:** The scoreboard sometimes dictates that the conservative or alternatively – the gambling shot, is the one to play

3:**STRENGTH AND WEAKNESS:** Play to your own strength and your opponent's weakness. Your best guide is your own team's performance on that day, as well as that of your opponents.

4:**BEATING TOUCHERS:** In singles, pairs, triples and fours, the best response to a front toucher is to get one close to cut down a possible big count but to increase your shot options on subsequent bowls. There are a variety of possibilities for using a close bowl in front, at the side or behind the jack.

5:**DITCH DRAWING:** With the jack in the ditch, don't draw close to the ditch with you last bowl, just draw to a point past your opponent's nearest bowl.

6:**OPPOSING THOUGHT:** That shot your opponents don't want you to play is usually the shot that you are looking for. So put yourself in their shoes and think from their point of view.

7:LATE STAGES: Late in the game, particularly on the last end, in a straight choice between a "dead draw" and a firing shot inside with shot against, chose the weight shot. There are usually more options for a favorable outcome to occur.

8:**WHICH HAND:** If both hands are equally true, choose the tighter hand, because in percentage terms, it should be easier to play.
